Kathryn Belle Webb, 92, passed away peacefully, on Thursday, August 22, 2019 at Bear Creek Senior Living in Colorado Springs, CO. She was born September 25, 1926 in Mill Grove, Missouri to Claud and Iris Vanderpool. On October 21, 1946, she married Ellis Blaine Webb in Gallup, New Mexico. He preceded her in death on July 18, 1996.

Kathryn "Katie" was a lifelong member and Kansas Worthy Grand Matron in the Order of the Eastern Star. She enjoyed singing and playing the piano. She loved cooking, hiking and playing card games with her family. Her beloved pets were a big part of her life, also.

Katie and Ellis owned Pratt Glass Company in Pratt, Kansas from 1947 through 1981. They later moved to Nathrop, Colorado where they both enjoyed retirement.

She served the Grand Chapter as Grand Martha in 1963-64, and was elected Worthy Grand Matron in 1967-1968. She and Brother David F. Johnson presided over the 92nd annual "Unending Song" session in 1968. Sister Katie endeared herself to many during her Song of Service year. "I shall pass through this world but once. If, therefore, there be any kindness I can show or any good thing I can do, let me do it now, for I shall not pass this way again."
